evaluating all of the existing wireless technologies the district had and then designing
a new state-of-the-art wireless network.
While the design was being finalized, multiple teams from Quest were busy evaluating and running cables around the schools
and district office to connect all of the


wireless access points that sit in the classrooms. These access points are the source
of the internet in all the classrooms and
offices around the district. As the wiring is
being completed, other teams from Quest
are busy installing all of the hardware and
access points across the district. Think of
all this as the plumbing in your home, but

the equipment is being installed, yet another team is busy configuring and testing
the whole thing. Finally, the project team
will be testing each site to make sure it's
ready for the new school year.

- Quest will provide reporting to EUSD on the performance and operation of the wireless network


